



PAN AMERICAN ROUND TABLES OF TEXAS

Florence Terry Griswold Scholarship II

The **Florence Terry Griswold Scholarship II** is awarded annually by the Pan American Round Tables of Texas. This Scholarship, named in honor of the founder of the Pan American Round Table, assists a female student or faculty member from Texas in pursuing her studies in another Pan American country.

Applicant Qualifications

An applicant must be a student who is a native citizen of the United States of America and a legal resident of the state of Texas. The candidate must be the holder of a bachelor's or equivalent degree or a college professor engaged in specialized study of any of the languages or cultures of the Pan American countries.

Application Requirements

- 1) Completed application form.
 - 2) Letter of recommendation:
 - o If the candidate is a college professor, a letter of recommendation from the dean of the graduate school or the head of the academic department in which the applicant has been or is currently enrolled or employed.
 - o If the candidate is a graduate student, letters of recommendation from two professors in their field of study that comment on their ability as a student and their desirability as a candidate for this scholarship.
 - 3) A graduate student applicant must submit an official cumulative transcript through the Fall 2025 semester.
 - 4) The Scholarship Committee Chairman must receive the completed application form, letter(s) of recommendation and an official cumulative transcript by **January 31, 2026**. Submissions **may not be** faxed or emailed, as they must be suitable for photocopying.

Terms of Scholarship

- 1) The **Florence Terry Griswold Scholarship II** is a grant of at least \$ 2,000 for study or research in a Pan American country (other than the United States), payable directly to the scholarship recipient upon receipt of substantiated proof of his/her plans for foreign study. *The grant is usually \$2,000, but in some years it may be greater if funds are available.*
- 2) Once selected, the recipient may be asked to complete a personal interview with a representative of the Pan American Round Table of Texas in the recipient's region.
- 3) The recipient is responsible for reporting his/her experiences and the results of their study to the Pan American Round Tables of Texas Scholarship Committee upon their return.
- 4) Pan American Round Tables of Texas is not responsible for the personal affairs of the scholarship recipient to the extent of providing holiday or vacation accommodations or job arrangements.
