### MINUTES OF STATE BOARD OF DIRECTORS MEETING PAN AMERICAN ROUND TABLES OF TEXAS

SAN ANTONIO, MARCH 31, 1957.

The State Board called to executive session, March 31, 1957, at two o'clock p.m., in the Hunt Room of the St. Anthony Hotel in San Antonio, Texas, by the State Director, Mrs. A. R. Davis.

The meeting was opened with prayer, read by Mrs. C.E.Bradley.

Mrs. Davis extended greetings to the fifteen members present, and the following visitors were introduced: Mrs. L.G. Waltrip, past Alliance Director, Mrs. W. W. Ely, Alliance Treasurer, Mrs. Aurora Lopez, Alliance Corresponding Secretary of Mexico City, and Mrs. D'Arcy Cashin, National Director. The Chair regretted the absence of Associate Directors Mesdames Wells and Rabb.

The State Recording Secretary, Mrs. Genevieve Cox, declared a quorum present, and the meeting was duly opened for business. A motion was made by Mrs. C.R. Nobles, seconded by Dr. Eleanor Pace, that reports of officers and committee chairmen be dispensed with, since they were to be given in open convention. This motion was amended to hear the reports of the Resolutions and Revisions Committees. Both amendment and motion carried.

Mrs. B. C. Judkins, State Treasurer, presented her report, showing a balance on hand as of March 19, 1957, of \$895.62. Her report is attached.

Mrs. F.B. Slater, Chairman of Resolutions, read the Florence Terry Griswold Fund Resolution.

It was moved by Mrs. Slater, seconded by Dr. Pace, that this resolution be considered by the Board. This motion carried.

Mrs. Bradley asked for a discussion on the Constitution revisions.

Under old business, Mrs. A.R. Davis reported letters written to three Tables operating outside of framework constitution. Dallas I and El Paso had more than 150 members. El Paso has closed their membership in order to bring their membership within the required limit. Bryan has men members, and has asked for help in order to straighten out this situation. Mrs. F.B. Slater moved, seconded by Mrs. Joe W. Neal, that the problem of the Bryan Table be left in the hands of the incoming State Director. This motion was lost.

After much discussion, Mrs. C.E. Bradley moved, seconded by Mrs. F. B. Slater, that the Board send a letter to Bryan giving them one year to comply to the framework Constitution, or action will be taken at the Board meeting in 1958. This motion carried.

Mrs. C. E. Bradley moved, seconded by Mrs. Alma Thomas, that the two Tables who are over 150 members be required to bring their membership down to 150 within one year, or action will be taken by the Board in 1958. This motion carried. (Motion rescinded by action of Convention).

Under new business, Mrs. Judkins asked that all outstanding bills be paid. These bills included Pan Americana-Texana. Mrs. F.B. Slater, seconded by Mrs. Dave Pumphrey, moved that these bills be paid. Motion carried.

Mrs. J. C. Nelson took the Chair, and Dr. Eleanor Pace moved, seconded by Mrs. Joe W. Neal, that the bill of \$186.97, the expenses of State Director, be paid. This motion carried.

The State Director resumed the Chair.

Mrs. B.C. Judkins reported that the Memorial Cards for the Griswold Fund cost \$7.00, which left a balance of \$10.00 from money contributed by the members of the Board at the Austin meeting. Mrs. C.P. Trotter moved, seconded by Mrs. Clyde C. Clack, that the ten dollars be given to the Griswold Fund. Motion carried.

Mrs. F.B. Slater moved, seconded by Dr. Eleanor Pace, that sufficient funds be allowed to complete the State work of officers and committeemen for the years 1955-57. The motion carried.

Mrs. Davis announced that San Antonio has presented the State with a steel cabinet for the Archives, which are located at the Simon Bolivar Library. It was suggested by the State Director that the Archives Committee be allowed to dispose of unneeded material.

Mrs. W.P. McComb suggested that the scrapbooks be made uniform in each Table and the historian put work in writing.

A suggestion was made that we take out membership in the Good Neighbor Commission, but our Constitution does not permit such membership.

Mrs. J.C. Nelson moved, seconded by Mrs. C.E. Bradley, that the date used on all printed matter for the State give the founding date, October 16, 1916. The motion carried.

Mrs. Joe W. Neal read a letter from Pan American School in Monterrey asking for financial aid. Mrs. J.C. Nelson moved, and seconded by Mrs. Frank Slater, that this matter referred to individual Tables. After a discussion the motion was withdrawn.

Mrs. Clyde C. Clack moved, seconded by Dr. Pace, that the State Treasurer be bonded. The motion was lost.

Mrs. Clyde C. Clack then presented resolutions on the Florence Terry Griswold Scholarship. Action was taken on a motion by Mr. Clack, seconded by Mrs. Slater, that a committee of three, including the Chairman of the Florence Terry Griswold Scholarship Fund, to select and screen applicants for the scholarship. Motion carried.

Mrs. Clyde C. Clack moved, seconded by Mrs. Joe W. Neal, that the recipient of this scholarship is expected to return home and use her training in her home country. The motion carried.

Mrs. Clyde C. Clack moved, seconded by Mrs. W.P. McComb, that a minimum of twenty-five cents per capita be contributed to the support of the Florence Terry Griswold Scholarship Fund. Mrs. Thomas moved, seconded by Mrs. Judkins, to table this motion. Motion carried.

Mrs. Clyde C. Clack moved, seconded by Mrs. Slater, that the Florence Terry Griswold Scholarship Funds be handled by the State Treasurer in a separate interest-bearing account. The motion carried.

Mrs. C.E. Bradley read and the Board discussed proposed changed in the State Constitution.

Mrs. Davis stated that she expects to go out of office in one month, and so all books must be closed within that time.

Mrs. Clack moved, seconded by Mrs. Judkins, that the meeting adjourn until after dinner.

Following a delightful buffet supper at the home of Mrs. J.C. Nelson, the Board was called into session at nine o'clock p.m., a quorum was declared present, and Mrs. Bradley resumed a reading of the Constitution and By-Laws revisions.

Article I, Section 2, a and b, were discussed as to rearrangement.

Mrs. Bradley then moved, seconded by Mrs. F.B. Slater of Dallas, that the four Associate Directors shall constitute an Extension Board, with the first Associate Director as Chairman. After much discussion, the motion carried.

Article III, Section 1, of the By-Laws was to be reworded to state that no Table would pay dues less than \$15.00.

Mrs. C.R. Noble, San Antonio, seconded by Mrs. Clyde C. Clack, Dallas, moved that the meeting adjourn. The motion carried, and adjournment was taken at ten o'clock p.m.

The Board then viewed a color television show in which several of our members appeared in colorful authentic costumes of Latin American countries.
