SECOND ASSOCIATE DIRECTOR, STATE OF TEXAS
PAN AMERICAN ROUND TABLE

On March 12, 1958, the writer visited Edinburg, Texas, where, with the able assistance of Mrs. Harrison W. Riddle, Director of the Alamo-San Juan Round Table, a new Table was organized, and Mrs. J.
