I then created a new AD-HOC committee: Protocol Committee for the sole purpose of developing a handbook to be given to each Table to show the proper protocol for our Flag, showing respect to Table Visitors and Alliance Dignitaries, and any other vital information to help the Tables know proper etiquette.

In April I met with Isabel Vezetti, Immediate Past Sate Director, to receive her binder and box of information. I filled out the Texas Secretary of State form 802 and paid the \$5.00 fee.

After all the Board positions were in place, it was time to contact all the Table Directors and get a list of all new Table Directors and board members for 2017-2019. I then invited all Board members and Committees along with Table Directors and their board members to Laredo, Texas August 12, 2017 for our "Blue Print to Success," our annual PARTT workshop, to prepare for the new year and receive necessary paperwork and rosters.

In December I attended a Christmas luncheon honoring our new Alliance Director General, Sylvia Williams, and our "Pan American Woman 2018" Carmen Guerra in Brownsville. I also attended a Brownsville Table fundraiser "Christmas on the Border" that weekend. The following week I attended the Beeville Table Christmas Meeting on Thursday, then attended the San Benito Christmas luncheon on Saturday.
