### State Board Awards Scholarships

The Florence Terry Griswold (FTG) Scholarship Committee awarded two scholarships at the Board of Trustees Meeting in Southlake, Texas, on April 5, 2008, during the State PART Board Meeting.

Sixteen qualified applications were received for the FTG Scholarship I. The \$4,000 scholarship was awarded to Elisa Morales from Mexico, a master's degree candidate at the University of Texas-El Paso in molecular cell biology with a minor in virology. She has a 3.7 grade point average. Elisa is doing biology research infectious focusing on diseases and hopes to work in a disease control center to eradicate disease. Her particular interest is in fighting AIDS contracted through sexual abuse.

Elisa wrote, "I am honored to be one of the recipients of the Florence Terry Griswold Scholarship. Thanks to your generous support I will be the first in my family to attend graduate school."

Three qualified applications were received for the FTG II scholarship. This \$2,500 scholarship was awarded to Silvia Patricia Solis, a

master's degree candidate at the University of Texas-Pan American in Edinburg. She has a 3.57 GPA in the field of inter-disciplinary studies with a major of anthropology. Silvia is returning to Guatemala for a third summer to do field research in Nahuala, a town in the department of Solola where she is gathering field data for her study on contemporary indigenous women's sexuality.

### Long Range Planning Committee Report to the State Board

After almost a year of polling the Texas Tables, the Long Range Planning Committee presented its findings to the State Board. The Committee, composed of Rita Thacker (El Paso), Teresa Pérez (Rio Grande/Roma), and Ina A. Pool (Laredo), chairman, was entrusted with reviewing the structure and goals of all the Tables to make recommendations to strengthen the organization at both the individual Table and State levels. The Committee contacted the 21 Texas Tables who provided frank and interesting suggestions and opened a window into their Tables beneficial for the future of PARTT.

On the subject of finding Directors, the majority of the Tables suggested that the Directors serve one year terms. Limiting the term of office to one year may make finding a Director easier. Many large and small organizations have taken the one-year path very successfully.

One of the State Director's concerns was the lack of interest by some members in PARTT. Among the Tables' recommendations were careful recruiting, attracting young professionals, scheduling orientations, keeping meetings and programs short, encouraging open discussions and a higher community profile. Also emphasized were orientation programs on the Alliance and the Organization of American States and what they stand for.

Since technology has become an important part of everyday life, one suggestion was that Tables create a Web page to post minutes, newsletter and planned events, and encourage members to use the PARTT and Alliance web pages. Workshops on the use of the Internet and electronic mail should be encouraged. Also suggested was the use of periodic newsletters from the Director to give updates on activities, meetings, conventions and other information.

Another concern posed was on how to prepare future leaders. The Tables suggested that high school girls be invited to meetings and also be used as aides for Pan American functions. Members should be urged to invite their daughters and granddaughters to the meetings to expose them to the Pan American Movement. New members should be encouraged to participate in Table activities, and if necessary, mentors be assigned to them.

The Committee will continue contacting the Tables who were unable to respond to ensure that a complete report is submitted at the State Board Meeting during the State Convention in Brownsville, Texas, March 20-22, 2009. All Tables are encouraged to continue providing the Committee with innovative ideas developed during the coming year.
